Roof Update

This is a brief overview of our roof situation and an update with the most recent information. The trustees began looking for a roofing company to inspect and quote the social hall roof. We have been continually replacing shingles on that roof due to the wind. The recommendations have been to replace the 3-tab shingle (held in place with 3 nails) to an architectural shingle that is held in place with 6

nails. While they were there we also asked if the roof over the old Sunday School / Overflow area could be looked at. We had noticed a few areas of concern but thought part of the problem was the continual spring rains. The company also presented its recommendations on some problem areas of that roof. While all of this was happening the wet spring turned into an even wetter summer. As you are aware we had continual heavy downpours through the month of August. We began to have leaks in the sanctuary through the slate roof. The current company we are working with looked over the slate roof. We also reached out to several others. All the parties involved were asked to review the slate roof and provide the best solution: repair the current roof or replace it. If it is replaced, then what is out best option: new slate, composite material that resembles slate, asphalt shingle, or metal. Several companies we reached out to have declined to take on the project due to the steep roof and many peaks and valleys involved. It is a complicated roof to work on. The most recent quote received was from Bachman Roofing to replace the slate with a 40 year asphalt shingle. The quote is \$65,995. This cost does not include rotten or damaged wood. Bachman's has been giving us the best pricing to date. We are waiting for some other companies to either return phone calls or stop by and look over the roof, but it usually requires a day when it is not raining. We also have the flat roof over the old Sunday school

room quoted at an additional \$11,045 and the bell tower roof to repair at an estimated cost of \$11,201. The bell tower is an area of concern in that the water is seeping through the concrete deck and seeping through the stones and mortar of the steeple. The last portion of the quote was for the social hall roof which was estimated at \$28,285. The entire quote from Bachman's was \$116,526. We are still searching for other companies to compare numbers and recommendations. We understand that we will be facing expensive repairs to the building but it is a necessary repair for the long term. We also realize that this will need to be completed in stages. For example, the slate roof over the sanctuary will take priority over the social hall roof. As more information becomes available the trustees will get the necessary points to the congregation through the newsletter and speaking directly to the congregation. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to talk to one of the trustees: Brad, Jon, Bryan, or Keith. We may not have the answer at the ready, but we will work on finding one for you.

Overview of the Treasurer's Report:

Worship (Plate Offering) collections were \$16,670 below budget. Property receipts were \$3399.00 above budget. The rental property has consistently generated income, therefore property income was \$1500 above budget.

Disbursements for worship were \$3707 below budget because of the lack of a permanent organist. Property disbursements were approximately \$4600 above budget due to repair expenses on the Sanctuary roof. We are coming into heating season so we will be filling our oil tank and the roof needs to be replaced so we are looking at ending the year above budget in the property maintenance department.
