At the end of this month we will begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a season that essentially is a preparation for Easter Sunday. But why?

Why must we use words like penance, repentance, almsgiving? Why do we go through this process beginning with words at the imposition of ashes that remind us of our own mortality? Why do we need to sacrifice or give some things up in order to experience Easter?

So, I won't try to answer all of that here or even touch on the many different aspects of it.

However, I would like to give you a few brief thoughts. Easter is about Christ's resurrection. Jesus being brought to life after death. It's about what that does for all of us and means. It has implications for the entire world, and perhaps no event in history has ever affected the world more. The reality is though; you cannot have a resurrection with a death. You cannot come out of the tomb without first going inside of it. You cannot celebrate a victory without the strife of a challenge.

Lent is an opportunity really. It's a chance to give into some things and give up others so that you can experience life in a new way. That may, or may not occur exactly on Easter morning, but still it will occur. If you challenge yourself to participate in this season in a new, or renewed, way; you will almost certainly find yourself learning something, growing, evolving, being a new creation even in your same person.

If you'd like some ideas about how to experience Lent in a new way, please simply ask me. Even take advantage of technology to research a little on your own. I'd be completely remiss at this point if I didn't take this time to invite you to participate in our Lenten program called "Cross Training" as well. *Continued...*


