I have always been a "Spring Guy". It is in my DNA and not just because of my agricultural background. I absolutely love watching things grow. I love to see nature in action and I love being a part of it. I love the themes of rebirth and renewal, a time when life around us is energized from the heat and moisture of God's good earth. We see spring as a time of procreation for many of God's creatures. Spring is a prelude to life and life's abundance around us, to be enjoyed until the postlude of winter.

The Easter season has the same potential for Christians. Easter is a time of renewal. It is a time for all of us to take a closer look at the relationship we have with Jesus. As we progress through Lent in preparation for Holy Week, we have the opportunity to see the suffering in our lives as we reflect on the passion of our Lord.

Easter is also a time for us to be energized by the power of God's spirit within our own lives. As we observe the church year in our tradition, there is the potential for us to become lackadaisical in our participation in the life of the Church life becomes predictable and boring; therefore we disengage. But there is always the Easter season to breathe life back into our sleeping souls.

Most importantly, Easter is a time for new-life. Jesus Christ went to the cross as a sacrifice for the sins of humanity. No longer would men and women be held in bondage to the sin in their lives. Jesus' death on the cross, and the power of the resurrected Lord, was and is a act of procreation. Because we believe, we are created anew through Jesus. (John 3:3)

I encourage you to see this Easter season as a time of new birth and growth in your life. There are many opportunities in the life of Zion Blue Mountain where

The word Tenebrae is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness." It can also be translated as "night" or "death." The Tenebrae service is an ancient tradition in Christian history that took place on one of the last three days of Holy Week: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, or Holy Saturday. The purpose of this service

was to remember the somber events that occurred in Jesus' life from the exuberant entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through the night of Jesus' burial on Good Friday. The most distinctive aspect of the service are the candles on the Lord's Table. The flames of these candles are extinguished one by one as Scripture readings are shared to tell the story of Holy Week. This gradual descent into gloom is a representation of Jesus' increasing sorrow as the events of Passion Week unfolded. After the last verse is read, the last candle is put out, and the room is plunged into darkness. As the scriptures are read and the candles extinguished, we will be undressing the altar as well so that at the end of the service the chancel area is bare. I strongly urge you to come to this service and experience the power of the service.

Ghana Report

I returned home from Ghana on Saturday, February 24. Since then I have been readjusting to the temperature and the time change. It is extremely hot this time of the year in Ghana so I have enjoyed the drop in temperature in western Berks County.

I want to make a brief report to you as to how your Ghana contribution were used in Ghana. I will be putting together a PowerPoint presentation to be shared with you at a later date. I had originally thought we would be buying computers for a school in Ho but that was no longer needed. Your donations for Ghana totaled \$4200. At my discretion the money was distributed to three mission projects.

- 1. The Evangelical Presbyterian Church Health Care Center, Ho, Ghana I gave the clinics \$1000. The clinic is in need of lab equipment, upgrades in both hospital furnishing and bed space. There is only one ward so they need to construct another building. The furnishings are antiquated and in need of replacement. At the present time they are unable to do lab work in house so blood has to be sent out which delays treatment for the patients.
- 2. The Women's Resource Center Ho, Ghana The Women's Resource Center has a long history as a helping ministry for women in the EP Church community. Programs are in place to give young women the skills to make a living. Currently the emphasis is on teaching cooking skills. The kitchen they have is poorly equipped. They are in need of an upgrade. I gave them \$1200.
- 3. School Uniforms, Northern Ghana All children are required to where school uniforms. In the northern region of Ghana there are very poor children who do not attend school because they do not have a uniform and if they do have one it is very tattered. The Synod of the EP Church is raising funds to make sure all children have a uniform. The uniforms cost \$5 a piece. I gave \$2000 for this project.

The bingo fundraiser for Paul Eaton Jr's family was a huge success. I would like to thank everyone for your hard work the day and days leading up to the event and for your generosity, if you baked for the bake sale, if you donated baskets, worked that day or came to play bingo! Every person played an important role. Kimi was very overwhelmed by everyone's support.

This gave your church the opportunity to show the community what it means to be part of a church family, so many stepped up and offered their help with one of the many moving parts of the day. Everyone who participated helped make it a success. We wouldn't be able to fulfill the goal we set forth to accomplish without the commitment and generosity of our members and volunteers.
