I have been busy in my work shop working on various items for a craft show. There are two crafts that I make that are symbols of the meaning of Easter. The first is what Sharon and I call "The Empty Tomb". I make them out of 2x6's and 2x4's. I make Mt. Calvary out of the 2x6. I distress the wood and carve it like a mountain or hill. At the peak of the mountain is a gnarled wooden cross. In front of the mountain is the 2x4, also carved to look like a mountain and distressed; there is a hole in the mountain and a stone carving beside the opening. No explanation is needed.

The other symbol of Easter that I make is pectoral crosses, the majority of which will be going to Ghana. I took crosses with me in February 2024 and gave them to the church choirs of the Evangelical Church in Ho where I am a member. There was not enough to go around, so I am taking 100 in July!

People like these crafts because they preach the message of Easter without saying a word. We know the message of Easter. We have heard it hundreds of times. No one has to explain it to us.

This month, we will hear the story again—the same story we have heard a hundred times. The challenge for me and all others who shape our worship is how can we tell the story in a new way. I am not sure we can but as a worshiper, you can hear the message more deeply.

As we prepare for Holy Week, open your hearts and minds to receive the good news. Embrace the passion narrative and allow it to touch the brokenness that may be inside you. Celebrate the message of Easter morning, a message of new life.

There are three special services that will help you engage the Easter story: Palm Sunday, Good Friday Tenebrae service, and Easter morning worship; dates and times are listed below. My prayer is that you too, can come to the tomb and shout with full confidence,

"He is not here! He is risen!" the same story we have heard a hundred times with the same ending! Glory be to God!! Blessings, Pastor Pat


